Our Mission / Our History

*Impacting the St. Louis Metropolitan community through
Education, Awareness, Resources and Support
concerning breast health, breast cancer and breast cancer prevention and screening.*

The Breakfast Club Inc. (BCI) was founded in January, 1997 when three breast cancer survivors met for four hours over breakfast with a young woman who had just received a diagnosis of breast cancer. They discussed options of care and coping mechanisms with her. At the end of this meeting the woman asked if the three would meet with her again the following month. Within six months, the meeting had grown to ten women. In 1999, The Breakfast Club Inc. became a formalized group and incorporated, and in August, 2000 BCI became a not-for-profit tax-exempt agency to better serve the community. Throughout the years, BCI has over 200 members. BCI currently has a nine-member board of directors that oversees its programs.

Since its inception, through our signature programs, BCI has provided education regarding breast health to more than 27,500 people and support services to more than 1000 breast cancer survivors. The Bra & Breast Form Program has distributed over 2,600 bras and more than 1,200 breast prostheses to women who could not afford them. The Breast Health Buddy Program offers one-on-one support to women who have recently received a diagnosis of breast cancer. The Buddy helps alleviate the patient's fears, accompanying her to treatments as needed, and assisting in finding resources and support. The Buddies also visit senior residences and community venues, encouraging women to get mammography screening. Through the Faith on the Move program, BCI has made mammograms accessible to over 7,500 women. The Breast Health Outside the Box program seeks to educate and provide resources to those who are not our typical target group, including high school students. To newly diagnosed patients, we offer Comfort Kits, which include gift cards, a journal, educational materials, and personal care items. Each spring, the Annual Breast

Health Educational Seminar is held, featuring local breast cancer experts who present on current breast cancer topics. Spiritual Advisors are on call when there is a need for prayer, advice and counseling. We offer Monthly Support Meetings for survivors and their significant others to come together and share experiences...and yes, breakfast is served! The Breakfast Club, Inc. is a family that comes together to support each other during our cancer journey...whether smooth or bumpy, we are here....FOR YOU!

Dr. Katherine Glover-Collins is a native of Pine Bluff, Arkansas. She is a 1997 honor graduate (salutatorian) from Pine Bluff High School. Dr. Glover-Collins received her Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree from Xavier University in New Orleans, LA, graduating magna cum laude. She received her Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) degree and her Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) degree from Meharry Medical College School of Graduate Studies. She completed her surgical residency at University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and her Breast Surgery Fellowship at Washington University in St Louis, MO.

Dr. Glover-Collins is a member of the American Society of Breast Surgeons, the Society of Surgical Oncology, and the Society of Black Academic Surgeons. She is the recipient of numerous awards, honors, scholarships and research fellowships. Outside of her professional affiliations, she is a member of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc.

Dr. Glover-Collins is married to Mr. Marcus Collins and together they have three children. She is the daughter of Dr. Leslie and Mrs. Mattie Glover. She accepted Christ at the age of 9 years old and was baptized at New Jerusalem Baptist Church in Pine Bluff, Arkansas. She is currently a member of First Baptist Church of Creve Coeur where she serves as the Youth Director, Director of Vacation Bible School, Sunday School teacher, member of the Inspirational choir and lends her expertise wherever the Lord leads.

Currently, Dr. Glover-Collins is an Assistant Professor of Surgery at Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri in the Department of Surgery, Division of Surgical Oncology. She spearheads the breast surgical services for the Siteman Cancer Center North County location and also operates out of the Siteman Cancer Center main campus on Kingshighway. For over 40 years, Margie, alongside her husband, Herschel, helped SLMGAC raise millions of dollars for many groups fighting cancer. Even after his death in 2022, Margie continued to be a driving force, leading fundraising and charitable efforts. The Breakfast Club, Inc. is a proud and appreciative recipient of funds from the group. We know that Margie was key in deciding to give us funds.

Margie has dedicated her life to helping others. Her motto has always been "Make a Difference" and has tried to stick to that throughout her life. She recently accepted the position of Manager of Development for Make-a-Wish Foundation of Missouri & Kansas. She is currently the Assistant Treasurer of Heat Up St. Louis. She was the President of the Promotional Products Association International Foundation from 1999 to 2001, and has served on the following Boards: Head Injury Foundation, Children's Miracle Network, and The American Cancer Society. For her commitment to service, Margie has been the recipient of several awards. She was honored as the Promotional Products Association International Woman of Achievement in 2011 and was inducted into the Promotional Products Hall of Fame in 2017. She received the International Humanitarian Award and the Distinguished Service Award in 2012.

Nicole Robinson, EdD



Dr. Nicole Robinson is a St. Louis native, community change agent, and advocate dedicated to making a lasting impact. She currently serves as Vice President of Public Policy and Community Solutions for a national developer, McCormack Baron Salazar. A lifelong learner and leader, Nicole holds an EdD in Education & Psychology from Pepperdine University, an MBA from Fontbonne University, and a BS in Management from National Louis University. She is also a proud alumnus of Central Visual Performing Arts High School.

After being diagnosed with Stage 2 breast cancer, Dr. Nicole founded Hatz 4 Hearts, transforming her personal battle into a movement of hope. What began as a deeply personal challenge evolved into an organization that uplifts cancer patients through simple yet powerful gestures of kindness, reminding them they are not alone in the fight. Nicole's journey began with an unexpected struggle of losing her hair to chemotherapy. "Losing your hair as a woman can be one of the most distressing experiences. I wrestled with maintaining my identity when I could no longer recognize the person in the mirror." Despite her own physical challenges, Nicole's faith, HOPE, and fighting spirit remained unshaken. In 2014, she began hosting events to collect new hats and headwear for cancer patients. As her advocacy grew, so did her purpose. By 2015, Nicole was celebrating her survivorship by promoting breast health awareness and expanding her foundation's reach. Even after her re-diagnosis with Stage 4 metastatic breast cancer in 2018, Nicole's determination never faltered. Instead, her vision for Hatz 4 Hearts grew stronger.

Hatz 4 Hearts provides breast cancer awareness and education to empower communities. Its Positively YOU Patient Care Grants are awarded annually to help patients with treatment-related needs. The foundation's flagship event, the Pink Carpet Community Gala, is a vibrant celebration of survivorship and the cornerstone of its fundraising efforts. Members of The Breakfast Club have been the recipients of Hatz 4 Hearts' generosity, and some have been honorees at the Pink Carpet Community Gala.

Terri R. Coffman



Terri R. Coffman is a Breast Health Center Mammographer. She began as a mammography technician 41 years ago in 1983 at the Breast Health Center at Barnes-Jewish Hospital and Washington University School of Medicine. In 1986, Barnes-Jewish Hospital received its first mammography van and she became one of the first drivers for the van program, driving around the St. Louis Community, screening women for breast cancer. For the last 38 years, she has continued serving in the technician role and driving the van. She has driven four (4) different van models in that timeframe! She states that she has enjoyed working with the Breakfast

Club buddies, together doing great things with outreach programs and serving our communities. She stresses that we have to get the word out about how important it is to catch breast cancer early in order to save more women.

Last year, Terri was diagnosed with Stage 1 breast cancer. She says that she is doing great because it was caught so early due to getting routine mammograms every year. Together with the Breakfast Club, she believes that we have saved many women's lives and we will continue to do so.

Terri, as a mammographer, you have saved the lives of so many women. As a survivor, you are inspiring even more, letting them know that through early detection, they can live a wonderful and fulfilling life. You are living proof! Although we would have preferred that you did not get breast cancer, we welcome you with open arms into our community of survivors. Together we will continue the fight! Lannis Hall, MD, MPH



Dr. Lannis Hall is the Director of Radiation Oncology at Siteman Cancer Center, Barnes-Jewish St. Peters Hospital, and an Associate Professor of Clinical Radiation Oncology at Washington University School of Medicine. She also serves as the Director of Clinical Trials Outreach and Vice Chair of the Research Committee at Siteman Cancer Center. For the past 15 years, Dr. Hall has provided oversight for the effective recruitment of women and minorities into clinical trials at Siteman Cancer Center. In her role, she has developed educational materials for clinical trials used in onboarding research staff, as well as video and print information for the community.

Dr. Hall is the co-founder of the Prostate Cancer Coalition and leads screening initiatives across the St. Louis region, particularly targeting high-risk men. She has spearheaded the partnership between Siteman Cancer Center and the Hazelwood School District, focusing on educating high school girls about early detection and prevention of breast cancer. Additionally, she is the lead organizer of the First Ladies of Saint Louis, a group of church leaders dedicated to the health and wellness of their respective communities.

Dr. Hall has served on The Breakfast Club Board of Directors for several years. Going beyond her duties as a board member, Dr. Hall often speaks to newly diagnosed members regarding their specific concerns and questions. She presents at the annual BCI Health Seminar, where she discusses recent breakthroughs in breast cancer diagnosis and treatment. She makes sure that the BCI is involved in events involving breast cancer, such as the First Ladies health fair and the Hazelwood School District breast cancer education program. 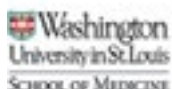
